Century **Farms** Go Online

Would you like to read a description of your farm? Do you want to know about the other Century Farms in your county? Now you can read about Century Farms across the state on the new and improved Century Farm Web site. This major project is nearly completed thanks to the diligent work of Kevin Cason, Century Farm intern and Ph.D. student in Public History at MTSU. The internship was cosponsored by the Center for Historic Preservation (CHP) and the

Tennessee Department of Agriculture through the Agricultural Development Fund. Proceeds from this fund are derived solely from the sale of the Tennessee Ag Tag specialty license plate.

At present, descriptions of farms in 84 counties are completed. Entries for all farms should be online by the end of this year. To protect the privacy and security of farm families and their property, neither specific contact information nor the exact location of farms is given on the Web site. If you would like to add a photograph or if the information on your farm is incorrect or needs to be updated, please get in touch with Century Farms staff at the CHP (contact information is on page 4).
